## OFFICE RELOCATION

Work on the new office will commence on Monday, May 10 and builders will be onsite from 7.30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday. They will not work over weekends.

Based on a pre-construction discussion, it is anticipated work will have a minimal impact on the normal flow of Parish activities. There will be construction noise and mess, but the Church and Parish Rooms will remain accessible, and the builder is conscious of the need to keep noise to a minimum during weekday Mass or other religious services.

The regular morning tea after weekday Mass will need to relocate to the Parish Rooms (if possible) or be suspended during the construction phase.

The office will continue to operate during construction from its existing location.

Construction is expected to be completed by the end of May, except for replacing the existing exit door with glass. Fabrication hold ups will see this part of construction being undertaken in June.

There will be some disruption, and all will need to be conscious of health and safety issues when onsite. Please be patient and vigilant.
