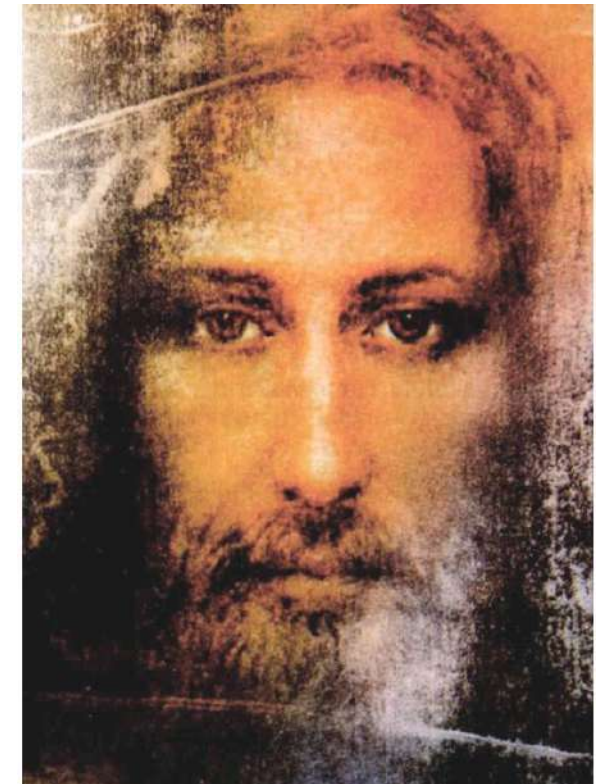

Lenten Appeal 2022 Special Collection

Money collected throughout Lent to be disbursed by the National Caritas Office for development funding, educational projects and emergency aid.

You can either use the weekly Donation Envelopes or use a Single Donation Envelope. You may either return your donation envelopes during the Parish offertory collection or send them to Caritas directly.

Donations received by Caritas in these envelopes by 31 March 2022 will be sent a receipt for 2021/2022 tax year. Donations received by Caritas after April 1st will be sent receipts for 2022/2023 tax year.

We welcome other items such as detergents, toilet paper, nappies, laundry powders and cleaning goods.

If you prefer to make cash donations these may be placed in any of our 3 collection boxes which are located in the Church and foyer.
