Gospel Matthew 13:1-23 "The Parable of the Sower."

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Saturday 15 & Sunday 16 July



Jesus went out of the house and sat by the sea. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed.

After that the disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?" He replied, "Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them. Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them. This is why I speak to them in parables.

Later, Jesus explains to his disciples that the seeds is the "Word of the Kingdom", the Sower represents anyone who proclaims it, and the various soils represent people's responses to it.

Our hearts must not be hardened against the things of God. We must be open, we must be moldable, we must have hungry and humble hearts to receive the Word of God. We see that when the message of the kingdom of heaven is received and obeyed that fruit is multiplied thirty, sixty, and one hundred times!

God is generous. He's extended his grace to EVERYONE. Even those he knows will likely reject it, he gives it to them anyway in hopes they will cultivate their heart and experience the life he came to give them.

The questions for us, them, are "What kind of soil am I?" and "How do I open myself to be like the good soil that receives it and produces more?"
