The Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand has adopted the "Guidelines for the prevention of and response to sexual abuse in the Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand" (National Safeguarding Guidelines). Safeguarding is one of the ways in we as a Catholic Community are addressing this commitment to protecting everyone including the young and vulnerable in our community.

Who should attend

Those who work with vulnerable individuals such as the young or elderly are required to attend/complete Safeguarding training as part of their ministry. 
